Reference List

The purpose of this list is to act as a quick reference guide to physicians on suggested fees for uninsured and third party services. Uninsured medical services are not covered by OHIP and may be directly charged to the patient or third party. Physicians may select the rate they bill for uninsured services, unless they are prohibited from doing so. This list suggests rates and fees that physicians may choose to charge however they are not required to charge the rates listed here.

The Multiplier

The OMA Schedule of Fees is a product of a multiplier applied to the amount payable for each fee code listed in the May 1, 2014 OHIP Schedule of Benefits for Physician Services to calculate an amount payable for an uninsured clinical service. The multiplier for the period January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019 is 2.29 (2.29 x OHIP Fee = OMA suggested fee).

Establishing An Hourly Rate

In the absence of a specific fee recommendation for an uninsured service, physicians can establish an hourly rate to assist in determining an appropriate fee. Since the OMA does not have an hourly rate listed it is suggested that physicians develop their own. Examples of how to do so would be to determine a rate based on an individual's gross annual income taken from their annual income tax statement (see this example on pg 14 of the 2019 Physician's Guide to Uninsured Services) or determine a rate based on one's average day's income divided by the hours worked. Physicians are free to use the methodology of their choice and they should remember to factor in one's training, expertise, experience and risk in their calculation.

Charges for copies of Medical Records



The OMA recommends that physicians charge \$30.00 for the first 20 pages and \$0.25 per page thereafter to cover the cost of copying, printing, reproducing or transmitting medical records including electronic medical records (EMR) when printed on paper. This amount includes the first 15 minutes of the physician's professional review as well as clerical labour costs, equipment lease, toner & paper costs, etc.

In addition to the above fees a physician may charge **out-ofpocket disbursements** related to this service. Examples of such include postage, courier, or storage retrieval charges.

If it is necessary that a physician review a patient's medical record before providing copies, this **professional review** is uninsured, and a physician may charge for this service by applying their hourly rate (see the complete guide for further details). OCF-23 Treatment Confirmation...\$143.05

*Service Canada will pay "up to" the fees listed above. If a physician's fees are higher than the fees listed, then patients are responsible for covering any extra costs.

Revenue Canada, Federal Disability Tax Credit...\$48.15

Please note:

In the absence of a specific fee recommendation for an uninsured service, physicians can apply their hourly rate to the service performed to determine an appropriate fee.

Note: For third party requested forms or reports, an appropriate assessment fee may be charged in addition to the fee charged for completion of the form/report, when the assessment is not medically necessary.

Block Fee Billing

The CPSO policy on Block Billing should be reviewed in detail before a physician constructs a block fee billing system in their practice.

A block fee is defined as a flat fee charged by a physician for a predetermined set of uninsured services during a predetermined period of time (no less than 3 months and no more than 1 year). Physicians are not required to offer a block fee option but can rather charge patients on a fee-for-service basis for uninsured services. Physicians who do choose to offer a block fee must also offer uninsured services separately at individual costs to patients. Patients are not required to pay a block fee.

The CPSO's policy on block fees states that physicians may use third party companies to assist them to administer a block fee or payment for uninsured services. This policy can be found online at: www.cpso.on.ca/policies.
